Parish Council News



The parish council are in the process of setting the budget for 2012/13. The council are considering spending on a number of areas but they would like your views on these. Your new parish council are keen to see improvements to the village and so are suggesting the following ideas for consideration in the budget for 2012/13

◇ Two flashing speed signs around the school

The speed limit has been reduced to 30mph in the centre of the village, around the school but cars are still not slowing down. The proposal is to install two signs that will flash when motorists are speeding to remind them of the speed limit.

◇ Funding to the village hall.

The village hall management committee are considering the way forward for the day to day management of the village hall and have indicated they may require some funding support.

◇ **New Play equipment for under 5's,**

The parish council feel that the playground lacks facilities for the **under 5's and thought this would be a nice addition to the playing field.** This new equipment could also be dedicated as part of the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations.

◇ **A street party or similar to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.**

There is a history of celebrating the Queen's Jubilees in the village the parish council felt it would be a shame to let this one pass by without doing something.

Despite trying several different avenues the parish council has so far been unsuccessful in finding additional funding towards any of these additional spending items. Therefore if all of these items were to go in to the budget the precept would increase. This would mean that for a Band D property an increase in council tax to approx. £35 for the year from £17 in 2011/12.

The village has a defibrillator which was donated by Knutsford Community First Responders. It is located in the Parkgate Inn and should you need it will give an audio step by step instructions on how to be used.

Knutsford First

Responders run 'Heartstart' courses which are free to attend and lasts about 2 hours. These courses include training on how to use the defibrillator. If anyone is interested in going to any of the future courses at Knutsford Methodist Church Community Centre, they are on 1st December 2011, 2nd February 2012 or 5th April 2012 at 7pm. Alternatively, the main trainer and assistants, would be happy to come along to the village, if a venue and two alternative dates were provided for them. They can cater for up to 20 people at a time.
