Chairmans Annual Report 2015/16

This is the first report of the new council term and I'm pleased to have been elected as Chairman once more. I'd firstly like to thank my fellow councillors and our Parish clerk for all their hard work and support. There are some new faces on the council who have already made a strong contribution.

Patton Close –

It's great to welcome new residents to the village and to see Patton Close becoming occupied. It has been a difficult negotiation with Plus Dane Housing regarding the section 106 and the allocation of housing which hasn't favoured local residents as much as the PC would have liked. However after protracted communication the PC did make some headway.

Parish Field –

The additional play equipment and the Circuit fitness equipment have been successfully installed along with a further picnic table. They seem to be in regular use and I believe this has been a very successful project. Particular thanks should go to Kathy Doyle who spearheaded this work. Kathy's aspirations for the field go further and she is a long way down the path in terms of developing a wild flowers and willow walk project engaging our school in the process.

Maintenance and remedial work has been undertaken on the trees surrounding the field and our Parish Clerk is chasing down a drainage solution to deal with the accumulated water in the corner of the field.

Village Hall –

The Village Hall's own management committee run a programme of ongoing maintenance and the PC continue to make a financial contribution to the running of the Village Hall. Please do consider it if you are organising a small gathering or event. Bookings can be made through the Parish Clerk. The Parish Council has continued to explore a number of possible alternate Village Hall locations with the support of both the Church and the WI. The Methodist Church have indicated there may be

a possibility of using their church building.

Broadband –

Whilst much of the village now has access to superfast broadband a significant number still do not. Brian Glover Smith deserves recognition for the work he is doing to find a route forward. A number of meetings have taken place and plans are being drawn up for potential resolutions and sources of funding.

The Village's On-line Group of Digital Eagles have run a number of workshops around getting the most out of the internet and thanks should go to Radbroke Hall for their hospitality. Our Parish Clerk has been active in coordinating a website upgrade and launching our own Facebook page, please do take a look and feel free to post and make comments.

We have found a solution funded by Colshaw Hall for our Christmas tree lights. After an electric power installation the tree should be a bit brighter this year.

The Parish Council continues to push for improvements in all areas of parish life. Looking ahead we hope to have an exterior mounted defibrillator placed outside the school.

Finally a big thank you to all those who recently volunteered to litter pick. A staggering amount was collected and our Village is certainly better for a good clean up, we just need to keep it that way. Once again it has been a great pleasure to Chair the Parish Council for another year.

The Parish Council has received a request from Cheshire Constabulary to work with them by offering each home owner in the parish a 'SelectaDNA' kit. This is a type of traceable liquid which is used to mark up valuable items within the home that are most frequently stolen when a burglary takes place.

Each DNA Forensic Property Marking kit is available at a vastly reduced cost of £10. The normal cost would be over £40 and each Kit would allow between 30 and 50 items to be marked including TVs, Smartphones, Desktop PCs, Laptops, Digital Cameras, etc. The marks can be seen with an ultra violet light and can be instantly traceable to their owners through the database. More information is available from the company's website – selectadna.co.uk.



SelectaDNA kits have been supplied to high crime level areas and have achieved reductions in burglary of up to 88% nationally. Recent results in Cheshire are showing results of up to 67% in Chester. Offenders have moved away from these areas which are clearly signed as having items forensically marked and if sufficient kits are sold we would be able to have

such signs – as now seen in Mobberley and Chelford – near clusters of houses. Police Officers and PCSO's from Cheshire Constabulary will be on hand when the kits are delivered to demonstrate their use and register them on your behalf.

All we ask is for an initial response by completion of the form below to indicate whether you would be interested in purchasing a kit. There is a minimum number to be ordered to achieve the low cost so we must ask you for your indication of interest prior to order.
