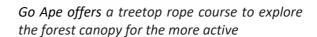
Time to catch our breath, enjoy the views and a group photo.

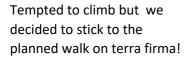


Marking the summit, this stone had some stirring words inscribed.

"About 220 million years ago, right on this spot, sand drifted on the wind and danced in streams,' says the plaque. 'Red marl was deposited from rising tides and, after the earth's crust split and rose up, Old Pale, the highest point of the sandstone ridge, was formed"

Photos complete and one last look around to admire the views, the group set off downhill past the Visitor and Go Ape Center and onto a walk around the lake.





The rest of the walk was relatively flat and the odd opening in the trees gave super views over the lake. As we neared the end of the walk and approached the car park one member announced she had brought along a home made apple cake.
