Use of Playing Fields Policy

Overall objective

Peover Superior Parish Council owns the Parish Field, which was bought by the Parish Council in 1938 to provide a recreational area for residents of Over Peover and their children to pursue informal leisure activities in a safe and pleasant environment.

Any request to book the playing field must therefore be consistent with this purpose and all such use is at the complete discretion of the Parish Council.

Conditions of Use

The primary use of the Parish Field is for informal recreation by residents.

The Parish Council has decided by a resolution dated 28th July 2020 that the Parish Council's permission may be sought for organised activity arranged by residents of the parish or neighbouring parishes.

Examples of uses the Parish Council would consider for the playing fields would include (but not exclusively) the following type of activity:

- Sports team practice, training, coaching and matches which do not impinge excessively on the general public's access to the field and do not exclude any other use of the playing field at the same time.
- Small scale organised exercise classes which
 - are not private and therefore open to any member of the community;
 - do not exclude any other use of the playing field at the same time.

Permission to use the Playing Field

A written request to use the field must be made to Peover Superior Parish Council before permission can be granted.

All applications should be made in writing to Peover Superior Parish Council (council@overpeover.com) and a decision will be issued in writing within 14 days. There is no right of appeal against the decision.
