Mother in Law's apple mincemeat recipe (Rumour is that because it doesn't have suet it can't be fattening - Yep we can follow that logic!)


2lb Apples finely chopped
(Golden Delicious are good).
10 oz currants and 10oz sultanas
or 20oz Mixed fruit
1.5lbs demerara sugar
(reduce to 1lb if you prefer it less sweet)
Rind and juice of 2 sweet oranges and 1 lemon
1 good teaspoon of mixed spice
3 tablespoons brandy or rum

Cook the apples in juices and a little water until soft. Add sugar and stir until dissolved. Add fruit, flavourings and bring to the boil for about 5 minutes. Add brandy/rum and bring back to the boil to burn off alcohol - not too hard! Pour into sterilised jars and seal.
