New Noticeboards

Residents can't have failed to notice the new noticeboards around the Parish. These were a necessary replacement for the old dilapidated boards that were rotting. The new boards are rustproof aluminium with toughened glass and sealed doors so should continue to look smart for many years to come.

We were able to fund these by using what is known as Section 106 funding that came from developer contributions from the Patton Close development. The funding is only available for community infrastructure for 15 years so time was running out and this seemed like an appropriate use.

We would like to thank local residents Alex and Ken Atkinson for installing the new boards. We hope you like the new look.

Tree Carving

There is an old tree stump about six feet high near the entrance to the Parish Field. The Parish Council, in conjunction with the school, ran a competition for the children to design a tree carving. A winning design has now been chosen and we have instructed a local wood carver to do the work in the near future. A significant part of the funding for this has come from donations received from Run North West in recognition of the inconvenience to residents for holding their 10K race around the Parish.

Replacement swings

Each year the Parish Council has a safety inspection carried out on all the equipment on the Parish Field. In the last report the inspector highlighted the yellow set of swings as a high risk item due to a potential failure mechanism.

We contacted Wicksteed who manufactured these some 60 years ago and they confirmed the possible issue and recommended they be taken out of service and replaced.



This we managed to do over the summer and the new swings look very similar to the old ones preserving the historic look of the field. Recognising that other equipment will need replacing in the future, the Parish Council has established a reserve fund to pay for replacements that cannot be funded from the annual budget alone.


